Packing & Shipping Blood

Packing the samples

Shipping package from your vet -

• Vets often get shipment of vaccines and may have a shipping package you can use. Just ask your vet if he/she has a shipping package you can have.

Shipping in your own package -

- Supplies:
 - a small/medium size cardboard box
 - o paper toweling
 - a plastic bag
 - a frozen freezer pack (Your vet will definitely have freezer packs on hand and will be glad to give you one or two.)
 - o newspaper.
- Packing:
 - Wrap the vials of blood in a couple of layers of paper toweling.
 - Place the wrapped vials in a small plastic bag.
 - Put the plastic bag next to or between cool packs.
 - Loosely wrap the sample(s) and cool packs in multiple individual sheets of newspaper to cocoon the blood and cool packs. It can take quite a few layers. Make enough layers of paper so that everything fits snugly in the box.
 - Put the dog information form & pedigree in the box.

Shipping –

- Ideally the sample should be shipped ASAP
- If samples are held for a day or over a weekend, blood must be refrigerated.
- Ship via overnight delivery (US Mail, UPS, or FedEx).
- **Do not send on a Friday** there will not be anyone to accept the delivery on a weekend, and the sample could be unusable by Monday.
